How did he get started? After growing up in Brittany, he headed to Paris to study music but ended up making documentaries instead.

So what you're saying is: he walked into the wrong classroom and was too embarrassed to say anything? Possibly. But it's all worked out rather well for him. We've no idea whether the music world lost a superstar but the directing world certainly gained one.

After a stint at the Museum of Modern Art and The Pompidou Centre, André began directing pop promos and immediately began winning awards.



Isn't there a Quentin Tarantino connection? You're thinking of his short film 'The Bridge' which was shown ahead of Tarantino's 'Jackie Brown' when it was in the cinemas.

And from there he went on to make commercials? It was the obvious move for such a skilful director and - as you'd expect - the boy's done good.

His Peugeot 407 ad won enough awards to be ranked fourth in that year's Gunn Report and he secured an unusual accolade in 2007 when a 90" commercial he made for Ford became one of the most watched of all time when it was shown simultaneously to eighty million viewers in eighteen countries across Europe during football's Champions' League Final.

Wow. A few of those eighty million must have bought a Ford after seeing that, wouldn't you say? You'd hope so.

Has he made any more short films? Loads. In 2013 'Delicate Gravity' won him the 'Best of Festival Award' at the Palm Springs International ShortFest and was shown at the Cannes Film festival that same year.

He's also co-written two English-language films: 'The Briefest Second' and 'Starless'... both currently in development.

Blimey, he's clearly a talented lad. We did say.
